




# Deadwood Stagecoach Days

Deadwood History Inc. and the National Stagecoach & Freight Wagon Association (NSFWA) combined efforts to put on Deadwood Stagecoach Days September 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, 2014. The primary goal of Stagecoach Days is to educate the public by bringing to life the history of the stagecoach and freight wagon industries which were so vital to the existence of the remote gold-boom town of Deadwood.

Opening remarks were provided by Deadwood Mayor Charles Turbiville and Deadwood's Historic Preservation Officer Kevin Kuchenbecker. Gerald Groenewold, president of NSFWA, provided a brief overview of the organization, its history, mission, and accomplishments. The weekend activities started with youth education as more than 60 fourth-graders were given stagecoach demonstrations and campfire cooking around the chuck wagon, followed by historical presentations surrounding the discovery of gold and the trails and vehicles that supported Deadwood.

NSFWA member Doug Hansen, owner of Hansen Wheel & Wagon Shop, teamed up with western author Mel Anderson to present a technical demonstration of rigging freight wagons and driving a stagecoach. Wheelwright Tim Hoffman, an employee of Hansen Wheel & Wagon Shop, demonstrated the art of wheelwrighting.



Demonstrations also included the rigging of freight wagons required to pull them in tandem as well as various methods of hitching to mules and horses. On a historical note, there were many freighters working in the Black Hills during the gold rush years. Records show that one outfit alone freighted in 19 million pounds of goods in 1880. Since each wagon carried from 8,000 to 10,000 lbs., at least 1900 wagon loads were required to deliver that amount of freight.

The stagecoach demonstration portrayed delivery of the US Mail, a variety of other cargo, including a strong box for transporting gold bullion, along with numerous passengers. The presenters noted that stagecoach travel took place day and night. The pace was expedited by changing horses at stage stops located every 10 - 15 miles along the trails.

The journey to Deadwood took two to three days from various locations, including Cheyenne, Sidney, Miles City, Medora, Bismarck, and Ft. Pierre. Wintertime travel sometimes resulted in the stagecoach transferring its cargo and passengers to a bobsled depending on snow conditions. This was required because of the dependency of Deadwood on the stage line and its services.

Several speakers provided exceptional presentations on a variety of topics. These included:

Dr. David A. Wolff, Getting to the Gold: The Black Hills Gold Rush;

Tom Lindmier, The Great Blue Army Wagon;

Robert Kolbe, *Black Hills Transportation Before* 1900;

Lonis Wendt, Trails Less Traveled;

Paul Hedren, Captain Jack Crawford's Adventures on the Sidney Trail; and


Elizabeth Watry, "A Ceaseless Rumble of Wagon Wheels" Recalling the Gilmer and Salisbury Stage Line.

Other artisan and craftsman exhibits included leatherworking, saddlemaking, blacksmithing, bit and spur making, gun smithing, and horsehair braiding; all vital to life on the frontier. There was also a wagon show exhibiting nearly a dozen vehicles including an Army wagon, a prairie schooner, stagecoach, freight wagon, chuckwagon, and sheepwagon.

Social events included a chuckwagon meal by Rick Kaan and a campfire gathering with a sing-along lead by local musicians. Youth activities during the day included a rodeo clown exhibition which involved the children.

The conference concluded with a roundtable panel discussion moderated by Doug Hansen. This was a marvelous event which we anticipate will become an annual partnership activity between Deadwood History, Inc. and NSFWA.
